NOTICE OF PROPOSAL

Pursuant to Article V, § 7 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and 42 Pa. Con. Stat. Ann. § 1503, following the Federal decennial census, the Court of Common Pleas is required to evaluate and (1) reestablish; (2) realign; and/or (3) eliminate, the individual magisterial district courts of the County.

Reestablish means to reaffirm the boundaries of an existing magisterial district court. Realignment is a changing of a magisterial district court's boundaries. Elimination is to abolish an existing magisterial district court and distribute the municipalities and caseloads to another magisterial district court(s).

Washington County (the 27th Judicial District) has eleven (11) magisterial district courts. After reviewing the caseload numbers, the current boundaries, population and demographical information for the County and its municipalities, and evaluating the workload distribution, the Court proposes to eliminate two (2) magisterial district courts and to realign each of the remaining nine (9) district courts. The result of the proposal would be an equitable distribution of workload within the magisterial district courts and a more efficient administration of justice for the people of Washington County.

The reestablishment plan for Washington County will be available for thirty (30) days to allow for public comment. A copy of the plan may also be made available in hardcopy by contacting Court Administration at (724) 228-6797. Written comments may be directed to Kathy Tarr, Deputy Court Administrator for Special Courts, 1 S. Main Street, Suite 1003, Washington, PA 15301, or by email at kathy.tarr@washingtoncourts.us. Comments must be received no later than the close of business on June 21, 2022. Comments must be specific, and include the full name and address of the sender.

At the conclusion of the comment period, the President Judge will submit a final, proposed plan to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania for review and approval. All public comments specific to the proposal will be included in the submitted plan.

EXPLANATORY REPORT

I. Introduction

Every 10 years, following the Federal census, judicial districts are required to reestablish their magisterial districts. This process is carried out under the supervision of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, which is vested with power under the Pennsylvania Constitution to establish boundaries, including merging or consolidating magisterial districts as required by the needs of justice, and the efficient and effective administration of the Commonwealth's unified judicial system.¹

Under the reestablishment process for 2022, the President Judge of a judicial district is required to submit a proposal for review by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts ("AOPC") and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania by February 28, 2022. The proposal is to identify the current magisterial district courts and set forth whether a particular district would (1) remain the same; (2) have its boundaries be realigned; or (3) be eliminated. In doing so, the President Judge must answer two questions:

1. How *many* magisterial districts are needed to handle the case filings for the judicial district; and
2. Where the boundaries of the districts should be drawn so that the workload is *equitably* distributed among the districts?

In other words, caseload determines the appropriate number of magisterial district judges for a county. Workload is used to align the districts within the county. To answer the above-noted questions, the judicial district was provided with the following information:

- a. Caseload filing statistics by each case type from 2014-2019 for each magisterial district.²
- b. Filing averages for each county and class of county statewide.
- c. Workload statistics for each magisterial district.
- d. Term expiration date, birthdate, and mandatory retirement year for each magisterial district judge.
- e. United States Census Bureau population statistics for 2020.
- f. Reports from Spotlight PA and PennLive concerning the magisterial district court system and their analysis of caseload and workload in 2018 and 2019. Links to that reporting can be found here:

The initial reestablishment proposal was published on or about January 11, 2022, for review and public comment. Following the receipt of public comment, notification from a magisterial district judge of his decision not to seek reelection, and subsequent consultation with the Judicial Operations department of the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, the President Judge instructed Court Administration to create a revised plan and provide adjusted forms with calculations in accordance with the new plan. The revised forms are set forth in this report. This report provides the reasoning for the revised plan, and the information supporting the proposal. These explanations will aid those at the AOPC and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, and others reviewing the proposal, to understand that the President Judge has carefully considered the Supreme Court's directives, the guidance of the AOPC, concerns of the citizens and taxpayers, and the county-specific considerations relevant to an efficient and effective judicial system.

II. Summary

According to the 2020 Federal census figures, Washington County has a population of 209,349, poised on the line between a 3rd and 4th class county. The County is made up of 66 cities and municipalities in total. At the last reestablishment in 2012, only one realignment, of a municipality with just 1,853 residents, occurred. Therein lies the fundamental issue confronted in the 2022 reestablishment – the boundaries and workload of the magisterial district courts have not been substantively adjusted for over a generation.

Following careful analysis of the data and application of guidelines, the Court is proposing that the number of magisterial district courts be reduced from eleven (11) to nine (9) over the next several years, and that all of the boundaries for the nine (9) remaining districts be realigned. The County can no longer kick the can down the road and fail to ignore the present inequities in its magisterial district courts.

Reestablishment is the only way to address disparities in the workloads among the magisterial district courts, and to ensure that the taxpayers and citizens of the judicial district have an efficient, equitable, and accessible justice system. This report contains the detailed reasoning behind the proposed reestablishment for Washington County and provides a basis for what is, hopefully, reasoned public comment in response. Ultimately, the approval of the proposal lies with the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.

III. Caseload

The average caseload for Washington County in the relevant period is 45,661 cases annually for a per-magisterial-district-judge (“MDJ”) average of 4,151. Washington County is a fourth-class county; however, the decennial census states that the County fell short of the third-class county threshold by approximately 650 people.

A comparison chart of select third class counties and all fourth class counties shows that Washington County falls on the lower end of average annual caseload per MDJ while maintaining a high MDJ count.

What is also notable is the change in Washington County’s caseload statistics from the last reestablishment in 2012. Overall, the average annual caseload in 2012 was 51,205 and the per-MDJ average was 4,655. Thus, there was a 10.83% decrease in filings over the past decade. An analysis of the actual filings for each magisterial district is below.

When reviewing the data, Washington County is clearly an outlier based on the average annual caseload compared to the MDJ count. Accordingly, the Court's reestablishment proposal for the judicial district calls for a reduction in MDJ count from eleven to nine.

IV. Workload & Other Factors

The second step of the proposal is to assess the workload calculation for the magisterial districts within the County. The workload, which is provided by the AOPC, is a weighting of judicial bench time by case type. Different types of cases require a different amount of effort from a presiding MDJ (*e.g.*, a criminal preliminary hearing requires more time than a traffic case). No district should deviate by more than 15% from the workload of any other district. Any proposed departure in a Court's plan must be accompanied by an acceptable justification.³

In addition to workload, other factors are relevant to creating a reestablishment plan. Those considerations include:

- a. Location of offices within district boundaries.
- b. Each district must be contiguous.

- c. Geography and major roadways.
- d. No district may be eliminated during the term of an incumbent MDJ.
- e. District boundaries cannot be realigned in a way that places an incumbent MDJ's residence in a different district.
- f. Voting districts cannot be split.
- g. Proposed changes can have staggered effective dates.
- h. Projected population growth or loss in a district.
- i. Foreseeable infrastructure changes.

It is understood that the goal of workload equity is to establish a basis to justify the need for the number of magisterial district courts within the judicial district. Unless absolutely necessary, counties should avoid having a minority of districts bear the brunt of case and workload inequities. Disparities in filings, particularly in low workload filings, such as traffic cases, can be addressed through allocation of staffing by the President Judge and Court Administration. Taxpayers should not be required to fund/ support? disparate or excess districts in such instances. With the exception of two magisterial districts, 27-1-01 and 27-3-10, this proposal meets the objectives and parameters of the AOPC guidelines. Otherwise, all other districts are within the $\pm 15\%$ workload deviation, thereby achieving parity. In addition, the proposal ensures each district carries a caseload that requires at least three staff members, and is met with the current amount of staff allotted throughout the County.⁴

IV. Operational Costs and Future Initiatives

There are significant savings to the taxpayers, be it county or state, with the Reestablishment Plan. The average annual cost of a single, commissioned magisterial district judge to the state taxpayer is \$188,700. This number represents a combination of salary and fringe benefits.

An analysis performed by Court Administration reveals that the annual costs of operation for a magisterial district court, excluding personnel, for the county taxpayer ranges from \$138,982.88 to \$50,153.79. These costs include rent, caring carrying? costs such as telephone and internet service and insurance, supplies, and equipment. The average district office cost is \$74,793.08 per year.

Using these two numbers, the average costs of a magisterial district is \$263,493.08. The Reestablishment Plan proposes to eliminate two district courts and consolidate operations into nine districts. Over a ten-year period, this represents a savings of approximately \$2.5 million to the taxpayers based

on the average annual costs associated with a magisterial district judge and office as identified above.

Additionally, it is the intention of the Court to move towards the institution of a centralized criminal court for all preliminary hearings in the near future. Currently, the preliminary hearings for driving under the influence cases are heard in a central location within the county. This policy initiative would bring preliminary hearings for each criminal case within one location and strengthen the case for a reduction in the number of magisterial district courts. For instance, our neighbor county of Beaver has significantly more case filings, yet only eight magisterial districts and a centralized criminal court.

V. Spotlight PA and PennLive

As noted at the beginning of this report, Spotlight PA and PennLive wrote a report concerning the magisterial district court system with an analysis of caseloads and workloads in 2018 and 2019. To be straightforward, the series was critical of the amount of time that magisterial district judges spent in court and the financial cost of the magisterial district court system. A review of their analysis provided a stark look at our County's district courts.⁵

In 2018 and 2019, the following MDJs had significant amounts of working days without a case event:

Additionally, Spotlight PA/PennLive highlighted that some MDJs in our County had significant number of days without any cases scheduled in the afternoon.

While the Spotlight PA/PennLive data has endured some criticism as imperfect, the information is illuminating in considering the question of workload. In addition, there are reasons to think that the Spotlight PA/PennLive data may actually be underreporting information for our County. In 2017, we established a DUI Central Court on multiple Fridays every month; individual magisterial districts are getting the data “credit” for those proceedings despite not being the MDJ who presided over those cases (we have used senior judges almost exclusively since 2020). Moreover, it is a common practice for certain civil cases, usually with service issues, to be scheduled together in a single day; however, the MDJ typically is not present (parties that actually appear have their cases rescheduled).

Below is a chart detailing the Spotlight PA/PennLive data for our entire County.

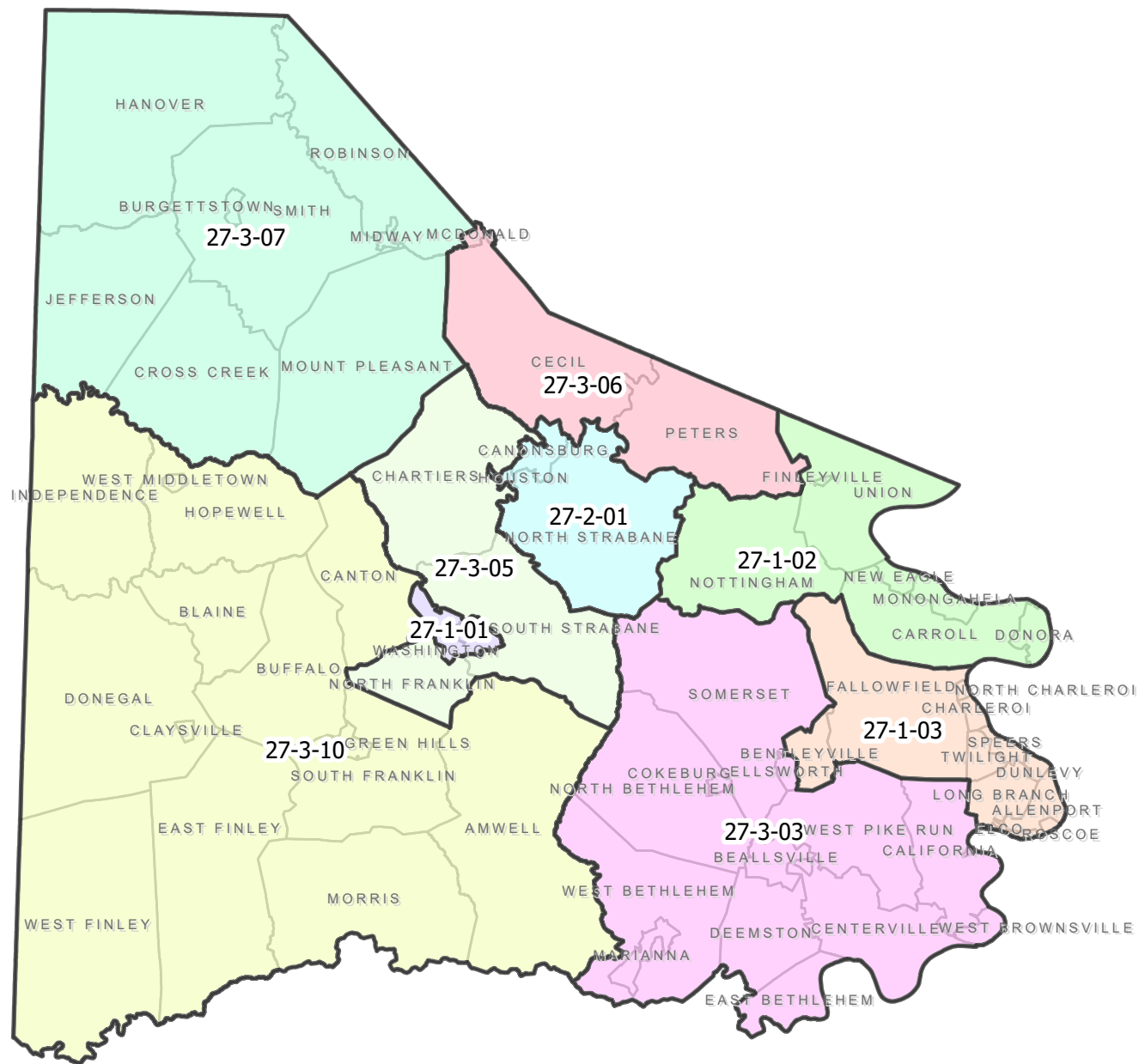

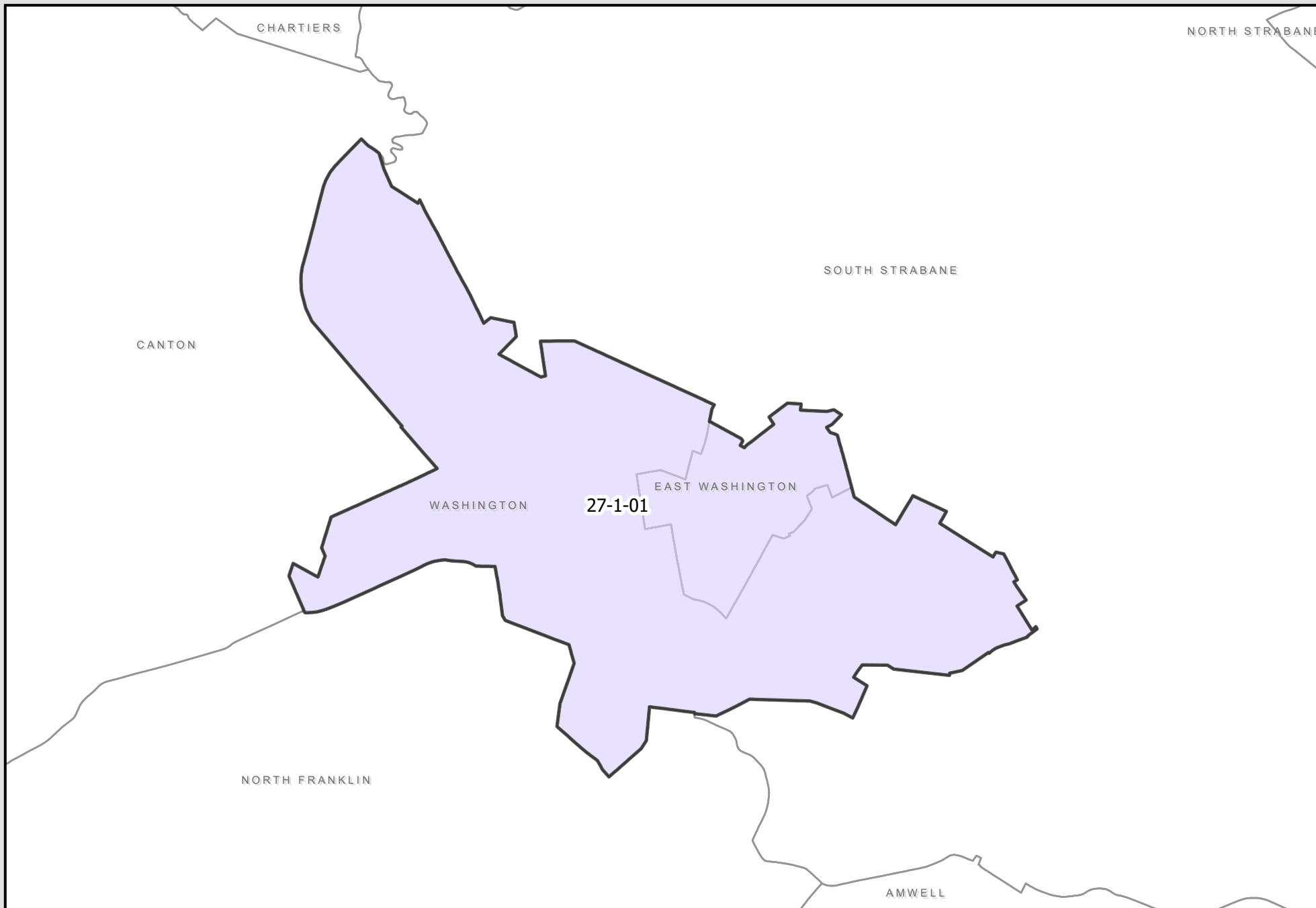

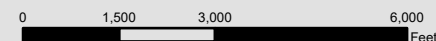


Magisterial District 27-1-01 District Boundary Update Washington County

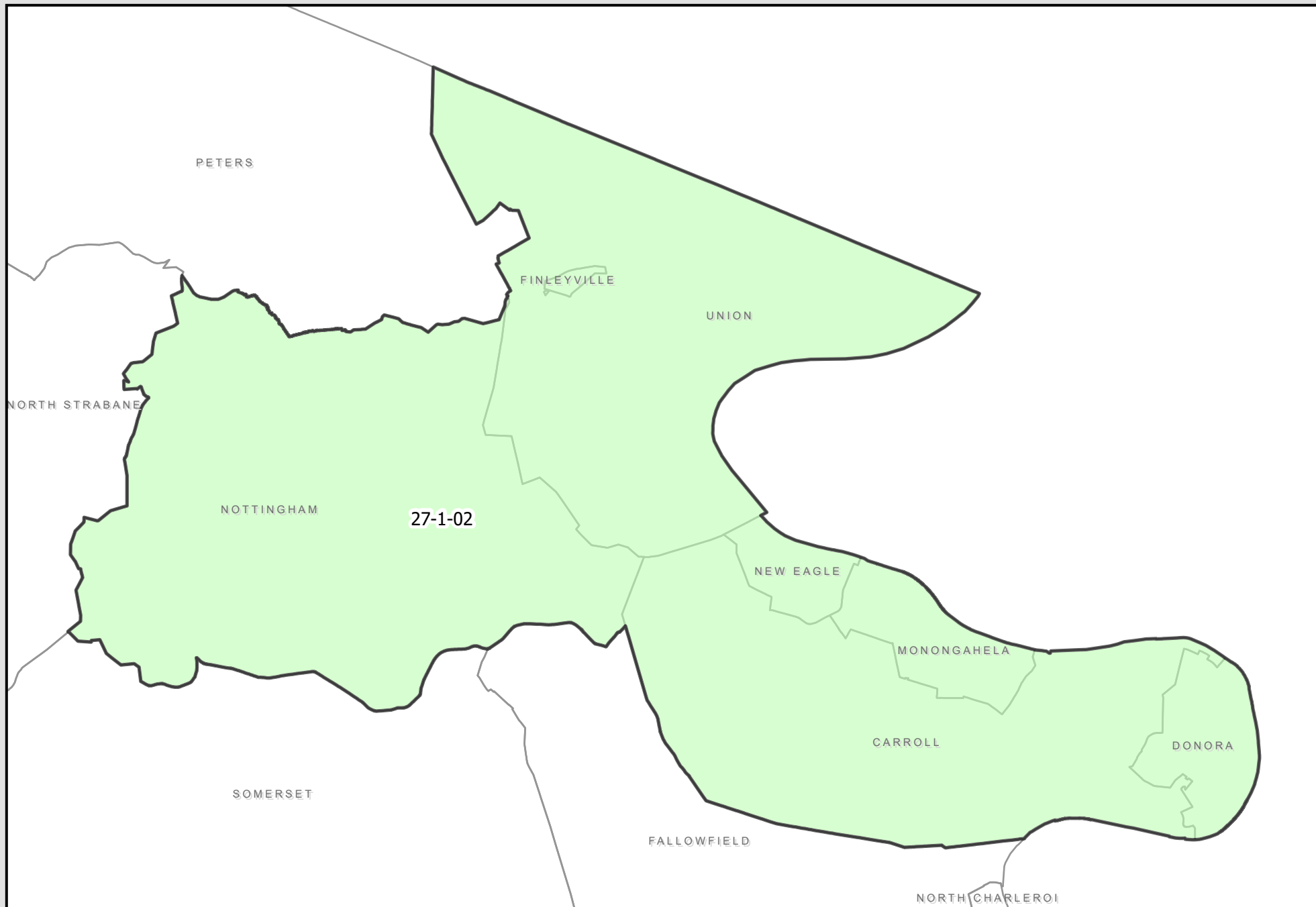

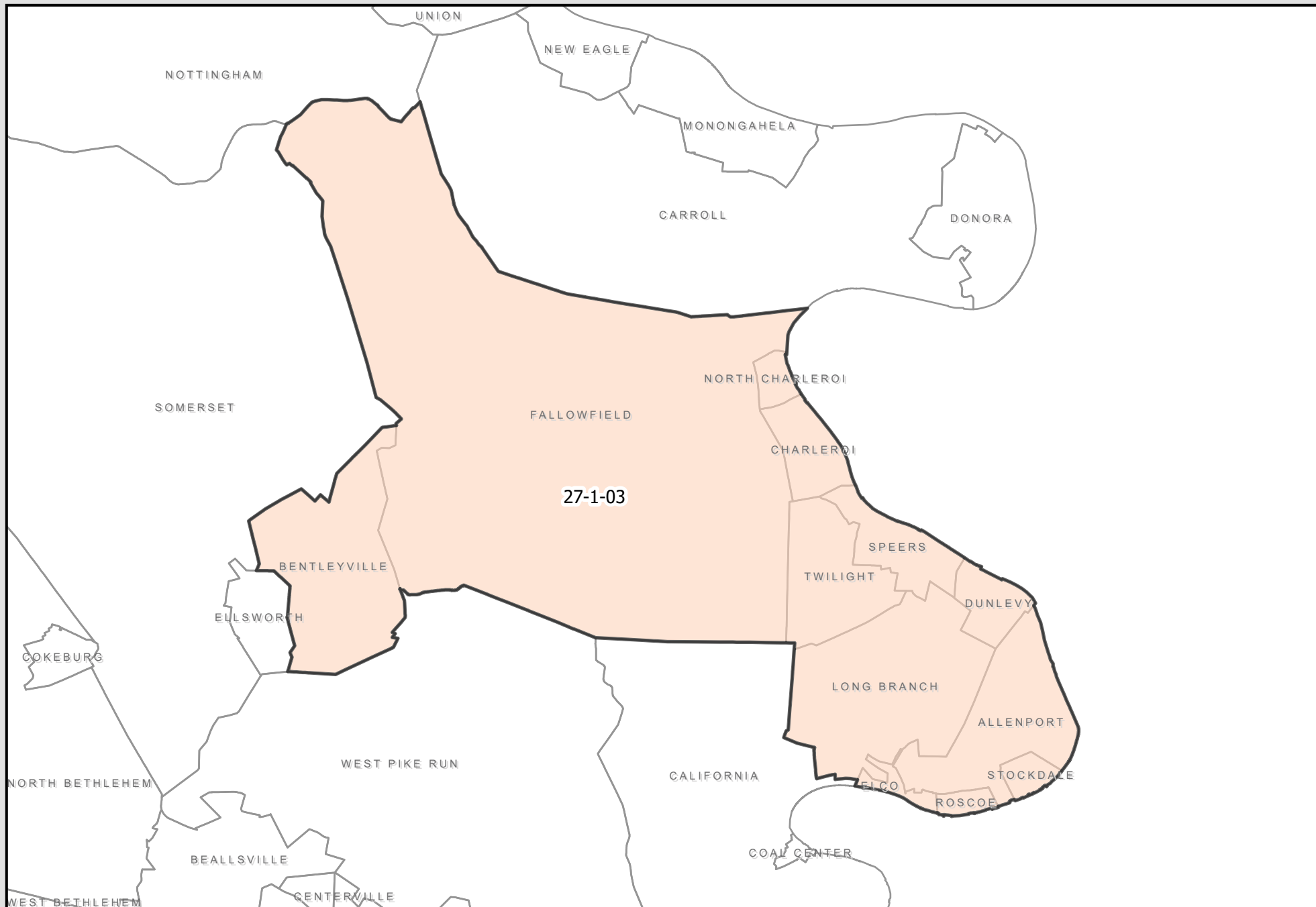

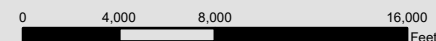


Magisterial District 27-1-03 **District Boundary Update** **Washington County**

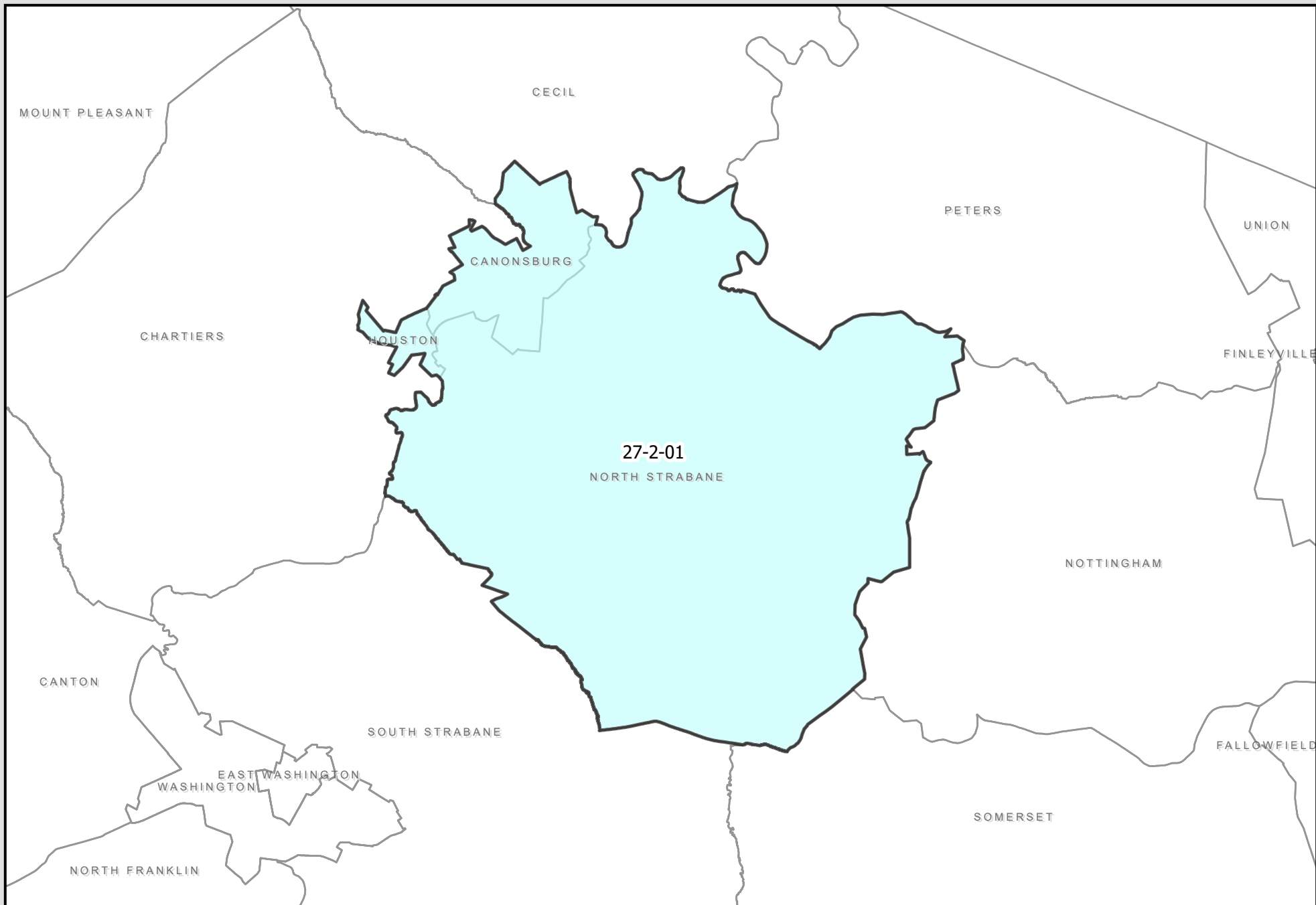

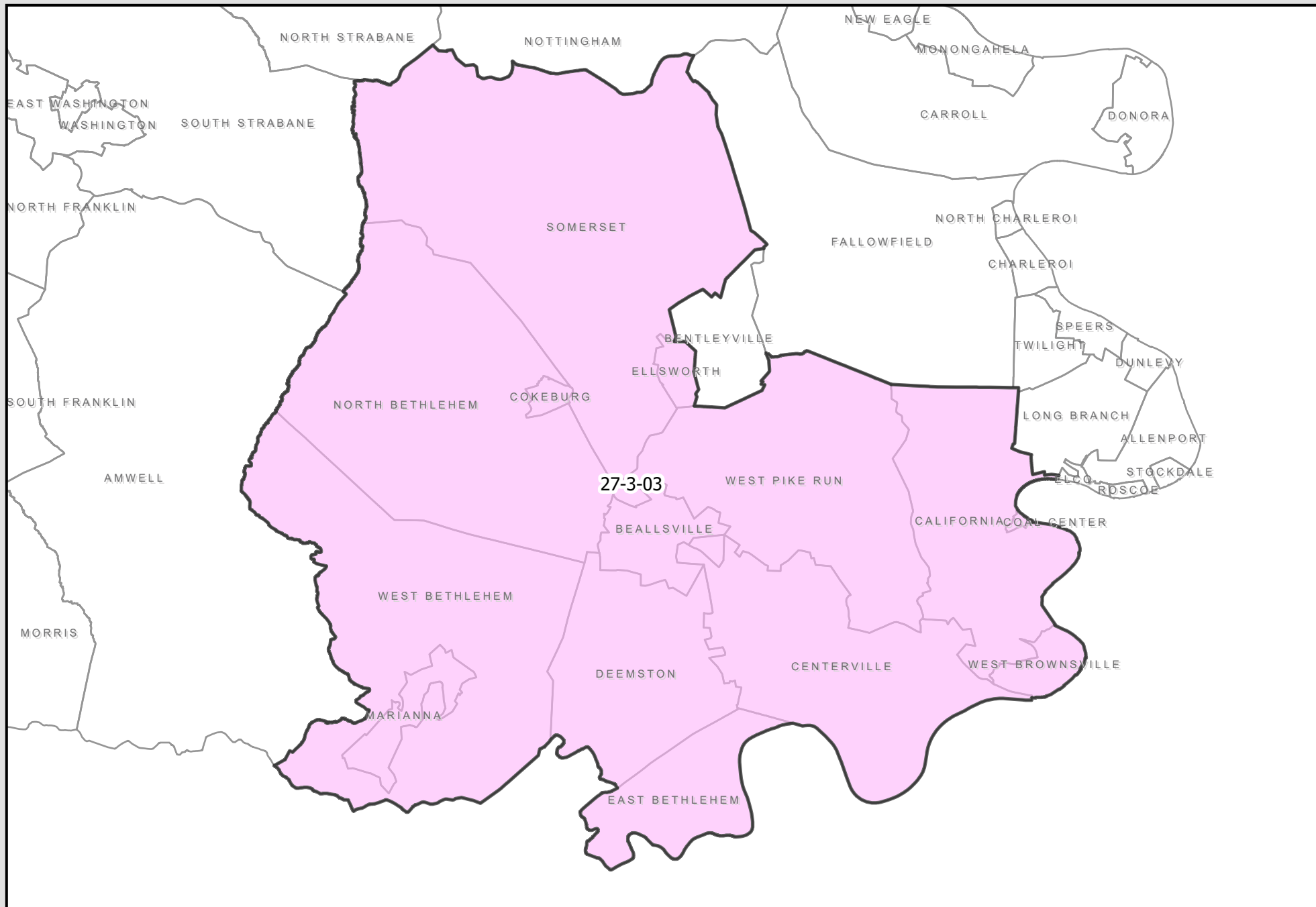

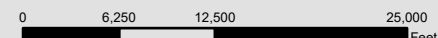

VII. Conclusion

State and local resources for the minor judiciary have been inefficiently deployed for the past twenty-plus years. Washington County has seen significant demographic shifts and declining caseloads but has failed to adjust to those realities. This was particularly exacerbated by ignoring any opportunity to address the boundaries and number of magisterial districts in 2012.

An objective analysis of the data and guidelines leaves one conclusion: Washington County should have no more than nine magisterial districts. Nine magisterial districts will meet the caseload and workload of Washington County. Nine magisterial districts will provide geographical balance while providing access to even the furthest municipalities. Nine magisterial districts will properly allocate the resources of the Commonwealth and County. Nine magisterial districts will deliver the citizens of Washington County with a minor judiciary that meets its needs for the next decade.

The opportunity to reestablish the magisterial district courts only arises every ten years. There was a past failure to address the changes in demographics, caseload, and workload for our County; taking a partial or half measure now would only compound existing inequities and inefficiencies. The Court's reestablishment plan is equitable, efficient, geographically superior, and satisfies the needs of the citizens of Washington County as they exist in 2022, and not as they were imagined in 2002.
